



Music Notes for March 28.

On Palm Sunday, we welcome Jesus into Jerusalem with songs of Hosanna. The opening hymn, *Hosanna, Loud Hosanna* (Ellacombe) remembers children singing praises, recounting the blessings they received from Jesus. The *Hosanna* that serves as this week's anthem is by William Mathias (1934-1992), a Welsh composer who wrote, among scores of other works, *Let the People Praise Thee, for Their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales on the occasion of their Marriage at St. Paul's Cathedral on Wednesday 29 July 1981.*

The closing hymn for Palm Sunday is *All Glory Laud* and *Honor*. The text was penned in the early 9th century by Theodulf, Bishop of Orléans. The music is by John Mason Neale, an English pastor and composer who wrote many hymns (both texts and music) during his short life (1818-1866).
