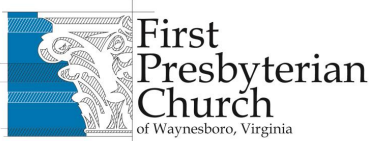

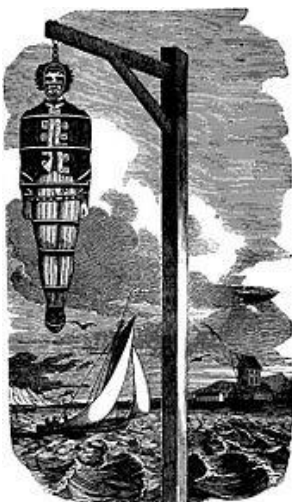

William "Singing Billy" Walker.

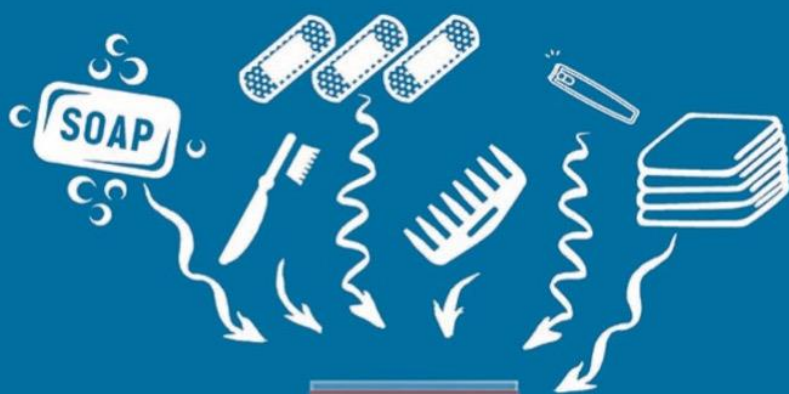

Original shaped note music from *Southern Harmony*, 1854

The anthem for the fifth week of Lent is *What Wondrous Love is This*. The text was first published in Lynchburg in a camp meeting songbook around 1811. The melody is even older, perhaps from the early 1600s. It was also used in the 1701 song "The Ballad of Captain Kidd." The marriage of tune and text as we know it today was first published in *The Southern Harmony*, a book of shape note hymns compiled by William "Singin' Billy" Walker (1809-1875). For this week's musical offering, the melody is played on the recorder while the organ intones a drone underneath.
