While Roger and Kimberlea are away, Jean Hashagen and members of her family will provide the music for this week's service. Lisa Shaw, Jean's sister-in-law, will play piano, her husband (Jean's brother), Tom Hashagen, will play guitar and mandolin and brother Ken Hashagen will also join in!

The anthem will be *The Gift of Love*, Hal Hopson's (b. 1933) most popular piece. Hopson has served Presbyterian churches in Nashville and Dallas and taught at Westminster Choir College. *The Gift of Love* is one of 1300 pieces published by the prolific composer, penned in 1971 and published a year later. Hopson set the text from I Corinthians to an old Scottish folk tune known as "O Waly Waly" or "The Water is Wide." Others who have adapted the song include Benjamin Britten, who arranged it in 1948, and John Rutter, who used it in his Suite for Strings in 1973. The Kingston Trio, Neil Young and Pete Seeger are among the popular singers who have gravitated toward the well-known melody.
