PDA Statement on Ukraine

We are grateful for the outpouring of prayers and calls from congregations and individuals asking how they can help. As the violence continues, the number of people being displaced and fleeing to neighboring countries increases by the day. And in the midst of the chaos, there are sibling churches and ecumenical partners who are already providing assistance with basic items for survival. Our first priority as PDA is to provide funding to these partners on the ground. While the scale of this crisis is new, receiving refugees from Ukraine and other countries in Central and Eastern Europe is not - which means we have trusted, established partners with the knowledge and expertise to carry out this important work.

We are hearing that the reformed churches in Ukraine and the region are also feeling called to join in the humanitarian response. PDA, therefore, anticipates that our response will include both financial and technical assistance as the network of faith communities providing humanitarian assistance grows in the months ahead.

Music Notes.

Lent begins this week, and for the first Sunday of this penitential time, the service opens with a modern setting of the ancient prayer, Lord Have Mercy. It is one of scores of congregational hymns composed by Dr. Swee Hong Lim (b. 1963), who directs the Master of Sacred Music program at Emmanuel College in Toronto. Throughout this Lenten season, the congregation will sing this prayer for the Introit.

The opening hymn will be You Who Dwell in the Shelter of the Lord, also known as On Eagle's Wings. Michael Joncas (b. 1951) composed the popular hymn in the later 1970s. The song was first recorded in 1979, and it has since become a beloved hymn throughout Christendom. On Eagle's Wings has been sung during countless services, from internationally broadcast papal masses to the 2007 funeral for Luciano Pavarotti.




Henry Wadsworth Longfellow born in Portland MN February 27, 1807




Experimental Naval gun explodes on U.S.S. Princeton, killing 6, including the Secretaries of State and Navy 28 February, 1844




Peace Corps established by President John F. Kennedy 1 March, 1961
