

This Week in History.




Egyptian King Farouk is overthrown in a Coup-d'Etat led by Army officers Mohamed Naguib and Gamal Abdel Nasser, (above), ushering in a period of decolonization in the Middle East.

July 23, 1952



The Potsdam Conference concludes with an Allied demand for unconditional Japanese surrender. Unaware of the existence of the Atomic bomb, the Japanese would reject this demand.

July 24, 1945



U..S. forces invade the Spanish colony of Puerto Rico, during its war with Spain. In 1917, Puerto Ricans would become U.S. citizens.

Irish playwright George Bernard Shaw is born in Dublin, Ireland.

July 26, 1856



President Herbert Hoover orders the eviction of some 15,000 unemployed veterans who had marched on the capital, demanding a promised World War I Bonus. Army troops under the command of General Douglas MacArthur, Major Dwight D. Eisenhower and Major George S. Patton would attack and burn their encampments on the Anacostia Flats.





U.N. and North Korean delegates sign an armistice at Panmunjom, suspending the Korean conflict.

July 27, 1953



Benito Mussolini is born in Dovia, Italy. Originally a journalist he would found the Fascist Party, serve Prime Minister from 1922-1925. and then assume dictatorial power until his overthrow in 1943. He would be executed by Italian partisans in 1945.
